FACTS & FIGURES

According to Open Doors' 2026 World Watch List, 2025 marked the deadliest year in modern history for Christians. Roughly 4,850 people were killed for their faith and millions more have faced violence, abuse, displacement, or discrimination worldwide.

Over 388 million Christians — more than one in seven globally — experience high levels of persecution, driven mainly by war, anarchy, authoritarian regimes, nationalism, and religious hostility. North Korea ranked as the most dangerous country for Christians for the 24th time, followed by Somalia, Yemen, Sudan, and Eritrea; Syria saw a sharp rise in persecution after political instability in 2024. Persecution is becoming more sophisticated, with tactics expanding to include AI surveillance, propaganda, and economic restrictions. However, Open Doors highlighted that the Christian faith continues to endure and grow despite attempts to eradicate it.

FEAST DAY:

The Presentation of the Lord (February 2nd)

The Presentation of the Lord is a Christian feast celebrated on February 2nd, 40 days after Christmas, which, according to Jewish law in Leviticus, was the time for a mother's purification and the presentation of a firstborn son. It commemorates Jesus's presentation in the Temple to fulfill the Law of Moses. Found in Luke 2:22-40, the passage describes Joseph and Mary bringing the infant Jesus to Jerusalem to fulfill Jewish legal requirements of purification and the consecration of the firstborn.

The feast is often called Candlemas, or the "Feast of Light," because of the tradition of blessing candles, which symbolizes Christ as the Light of the World. It is a bridge between the Christmas infancy narratives and the upcoming Paschal Mystery (Lent/Easter), highlighting Jesus as the "Light for the Nations". It is also known as the World Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life.

It signifies the meeting of Christ with his people, recognized by Simeon and Anna as the Messiah, Savior, and Light to the nations. The prophet Simeon recognized Jesus as "a light for revelation to the Gentiles," while the prophetess Anna gave thanks and spoke of the child to those awaiting redemption.

It is the first encounter of Simeon and Anna with the Christ Child in the Temple. It is in that holy encounter that Jesus' divinity is manifested by a human prophet for the first time. At His birth, the angels proclaimed His divinity to the shepherds, but in the Temple, Simeon was the first to understand and proclaim Jesus as the Savior of the World. He also prophesied that this salvation would be accomplished by a sword of sorrow that would pierce the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Anna, a prophetess, also came forward and "gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem" (Luke 2:38). Thus, these ritual acts were also a moment in which Jesus' divine mission was made manifest to the world.
