Belief is somehow intertwined with mind (reasoning) and faith indwelling in the heart, the seat of wisdom. In fact, we believe in many things including belief in God that means we have faith in God who created us in His image. Hence, we have the capacity to transcend to God, like a sunflower attracted to sun. I have faith in supernatural things. St. John Paul II released a profound encyclical called Reason & Faith in 1998: Faith and reason are like two wings on which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth; and God has placed in the human heart a desire to know the truth—in a word, to know himself—so that, by knowing and loving God, men and women may also come to the fullness of truth about themselves. If I may compare, theology = faith that redeems philosophy = reasoning, that's why we say philosophy is the handmaid of theology. The purpose of both concepts is to have an understanding of what we believe and store in faith: God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit whom we store or believe in faith. Both reason (belief) and faith are interconnected with a close relationship that we are endowed with by God. The only difference is, how you and I are able to analyze those concepts.
