KNOW YOUR SAINTS

Saint Andrew Dung-Lac and Companions. Dung-Lac was born to a pagan family in Viet Nam in 1795. His family was very poor and they travelled to Hanoi to find work. In Hanoi he was taught by a catechist and was fascinated with the Catholic faith. He was Baptist in the faith and chose the name Andrew. He became a priest at 28 years old. He was a tireless preacher and fasted often. The ruling emperor hated Catholics and arrested Andrew and a priest he was visiting. They were arrested and then set free. However, they were soon arrested again and supremely tortured. They were eventually beheaded on December 21, 1839. There were 117 people martyred in Viet Nam between 1820 and 1862 many of them were missionaries who gave their lives for Christ. Andrew became a Catholic because of missionaries who are sent all over the world. Saint Andrew shared his faith with many trying to convert the people of Viet Nam. His feast day is November 14.
