This week, we review the **category Internal: Hospitable Community**. This category focuses on survey items that looked at how we welcome and integrate newcomers, and explore the range of care, concern, and friendships among those within our parish.

#### **Our parish does a great job of integrating newcomers (level of agreement):**

- 22.4% Strongly agree;
- 34.6% Agree;
- 29.0% Neutral;
- 3.7% Disagree;
- 1.9% Strongly disagree;
- 8.4% Unsure.

#### **Our parish is a forgiving community (level of agreement):**

- 23.4% Strongly agree;
- 45.8% Agree;
- 16.8% Neutral;
- 1.9% Disagree;
- 0.9% Strongly disagree;
- 11.2% Unsure.

#### **We take great care of one another in our parish (level of agreement):**

- 20.6% Strongly agree;
- 43.9% Agree;
- 21.5% Neutral;
- 2.8% Disagree;
- 2.8% Strongly disagree;
- 8.4% Unsure.

#### **"Have you found it easy to make friends within your parish?":**

- 22.9% Strongly agree;
- 40.4% Agree;
- 25.7% Neutral;
- 7.3% Disagree;
- 2.8% Strongly disagree;
- 0.9% Unsure.
