KNOW YOUR SAINTS

Saint Lawrence O'Toole - Celebrated November 14

Saint Lawrence was born in Ireland in 1128. He was the son of the chief of a clan. One day a man named Dermot took Lawrence hostage because the young boy had challenged him. When he was returned to his father, the father told him that he wanted to dedicate one of his sons to God. Lawrence offered to be the son and he eventually became an abbot. He was a fair and generous man. When he became an archbishop, he invited the poor to eat with him everyday. Once he was attacked while saying mass but he got up and continued to finish the mass. He died in a monastery in France while on a peace-making journey, he was 52-years-old. He worked hard keeping peace among kings and nations.

BACKPACKS FOR THE HOMELESS

Interested in making a difference? Backpacks for the Homeless is an initiative which is reaching out to the community for help filling backpacks with essential items greatly needed by homeless people. These items include things like: socks, gloves, toques, toiletries and non-perishable snacks. Once the backpacks have been filled and checked, they are delivered to the homeless through participating agencies, such as Shepherds of Good Hope, just in time for Christmas. In the past 12 years, over half a million dollars worth of essentials have been provided to approximately 10,000 people experiencing homelessness in the Ottawa area.

So how can we help? Backpacks will be made available at the back of the church after the Saturday and Sunday Masses. All you need to do is to pick one up, fill it with the essential items found on the list included with the backpack, and then return it to the parish before the end of November. Across Ottawa, this year's goal is to provide backpacks for 1,500 local people living in poverty without a place to call home.
