THE LIFE OF ST. THERESA OF LISIEUX

Theresa Martin was the last of nine children, born on January 2, 1873, in a simple house in Alencon, France, to Louis Martin, a watchmaker, and Zelie-Marie Guerin, a lacemaker.

Zelie died of breast cancer in 1877, when Theresa was only four years old. Her father sold the business and moved to Lisieux in Normandy, where Zelie's brother Isidore Guerin, a pharmacist, lived with his wife and two daughters.

Only five Martin girls – Marie, Pauline, Leonie, Celine and Theresa – survived to adulthood. Five became religious, one joined the Visitation Order and the other four joined the Carmelite Convent of Lisieux.

Through sickness and dark nights of doubt and fear, Theresa remained faithful to God, rooted in his merciful love. After a long struggle with tuberculosis, she died on September 30, 1897, at the age of 24.
