#### SYNOD ON SYNODALITY

The historic 2023 Synod on Synodality, or journeying together, convened in Rome on October 4. This synod is comprised of 363 voting delegates, cardinals, bishops, priests, religious and lay women and men, representing the entire People of God. About 100 others delegates will attend as observers and resource. The participation of the laity has never happened before, precisely because there has never before been a synod that included the entire Church community. 70 of the voting delegates represent the laity from all parts of the world. One of those delegates is Dr. Catherine Clifford, a professor of Theology at St. Paul University. Our continued prayers are requested by the participants.
