On Ash Wednesday, the imposition of ashes will take place immediately after the 9:00 a.m. Eucharistic Celebration.

LENTEN DISCIPLINES

The Church encourages Catholics to make the entire Lenten season a period of prayerful discipline, with attention to:

Fasting & Abstinence: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat for Catholics aged 14 and older. In addition, Catholics from age 18-59 should fast limiting themselves to one full meal and two smaller meals each day.

In general all the Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence from meat, but those Catholics unable to may substitute special acts of charity on these days.

Prayer. Catholics are encouraged to pray more during Lent, especially with Scripture. Lent is also an ideal time to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation in preparation for the celebration of Christ's Passion, Death and Resurrection.

Almsgiving: Moved by the sacrifice of Christ, many Christians combine almsgiving with fasting, giving to the poor the money they saved by eating, drinking or buying less as they rely more upon God's abundant grace.
