OTTAWA POLICE CLOTHES COLLECTION

Brrr, it's cold outside. Do you have some extra winter clothing that you can donate to help others, a generous act of charity that will bring hope to others? An Ottawa police officer who collects clothes to give to people being released from custody says supplies have reached a "crisis level." Special Const. Susanne Kelly has collected winter clothing at the Ottawa Courthouse for many years. "When prisoners were being released, they were coming to court from jails, not properly clothed," she said. People arrested in summer or at night often aren't prepared to be released into cold weather. Lawyer Michael Spratt states that because the criminal justice system disproportionately deals with people who live in poverty and have mental health or addiction problems someone can walk out of jail or out of court, having been found not guilty of doing anything wrong and literally be released into the depths of an Ottawa winter without proper clothing. Winter clothing and boots can be dropped off at church and we will deliver them to the courthouse to help in this time of great need. Your generosity is always appreciated and welcome.
